

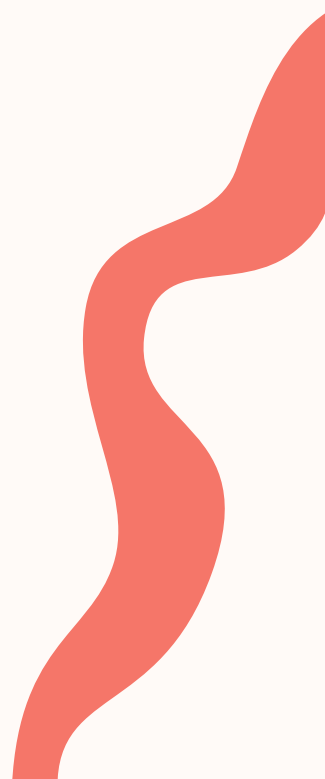

Vaccine FAQs

**To help stop the spread of misinformation,
let us answer some of your questions
about COVID-19 vaccination.**







Do I need to show identification to get vaccinated?

No. You don't need to have a driver's license or other identification to get vaccinated. You don't need to have health insurance to get a vaccine against COVID-19.





Why am I asked about my age, race, and ethnicity?



You may be asked for personal information like your age, race, and ethnicity to help make sure vaccines are distributed fairly. The government cannot use this information for immigration enforcement. Getting vaccinated or tested for COVID-19 will not affect your immigration status or any family member's immigration status.

Where can I get vaccinated?

All adults are now eligible to get vaccinated. You can get a COVID-19 vaccine at:

- Pharmacies
- Doctor's offices
- Hospitals
- County health departments

You can get a vaccine at Walgreens or CVS pharmacies without making an appointment. Other vaccination sites may require an appointment.
