Question of the Month

Is the COVID-19 pandemic over?

No, the pandemic is not over!

Many of us know someone who has recently contracted COVID-19, sometimes for the second or third time. In fact, case rates have been spiking since early summer, resulting in a rise in statewide hospitalizations from 330 to 599 during June.

Among the factors in this increase are:

- The new, highly contagious subvariants of the COVID-19 virus that continue to emerge
- The fact that immunity, from either an infection or a vaccine, decreases over time

Although recent COVID-19 cases tend to be less severe, everyone should remain cautious, particularly those with preexisting health conditions.

The map at right shows the percentage of residents in McNairy County and its neighboring counties who had at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine as of the end of June.

At 55.3%, McNairy County ranks 30th in Tennessee for vaccinations.

Meigs, the highest-ranked county in TN, has a 76.5% vaccination rate.

78.3% of Americans have received at least one dose.
