COVID-19 FAQS

Q: Can COVID-19 vaccines cause severe long-term side effects?

A: Some people may experience mild to moderate flu-like symptoms after getting vaccinated; however, they are not permanent and usually last one day. The reactions indicate your body is building antibodies against the virus.

Q: How do my pre-existing conditions impact the vaccine?

A: People with diabetes, high blood pressure, and other medical conditions, as well as those who are overweight, are at increased risk for severe illness and death from COVID-19. COVID-19 vaccines are strongly recommended for people with underlying medical conditions. If you are in one of these "high-risk" categories you should strongly consider taking the vaccine to protect yourself.

Q: Are COVID-19 vaccines accessible?

A: Vaccines are free and available at your local health department and major pharmacies like Walgreens, CVS, Walmart and Publix. We also offer mobile vaccine clinics for convenient access. Visit our website to find out when we will be in your county.
