Vaccine Descriptions

Td/Tdap: Protects against tetanus which causes serious painful spasms and stiffness of all muscles, lockjaw (the difficulty opening the mouth), difficulty swallowing or breathing and fever
Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR): Protects against measles, mumps and rubella which can cause a fever, runny nose, cough and a rash all over the body

Varicella (Chickenpox): Prevents a rash that turns into itchy, fluid filled blisters that can scab. This rash can occur all over the body. If you have chickenpox, the virus stays in your body for the rest of your life. Later in life, the virus may reactivate as shingles.

Hepatitis B: Protects against chronic liver disease which can cause flu like symptoms with loss of appetite, fever, tiredness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, jaundice, joint pain

Pneumococcal: Prevents serious infections in the lungs, lining of the spinal cord, and blood which symptoms include fever, chills, difficulty breathing, chest pain, stiff neck, ear ache, increased sensitivity to light and cough

HPV: Prevents many types of future diseases such as cervical, vaginal, vulvar, penile, oropharyngeal cancers and genital and anal warts

Zoster: Reduces the risk of developing shingles which is a painful rash that develops on one side of the face or body
